U. S. Navy Completes the Excavation and Removal of Waste, Debris, and Contaminated Soils at NASA Crows Landing Flight Facility

The Navy completed the excavation and removal of buried waste, debris, and contaminated soils at the former oxidation pond area of Site 11A at NASA Crows Landing Flight Facility in March 2003. The project was conducted as a time-critical removal action in accordance with the requirements of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA). The oxidation ponds were part of the original sewage treatment facility that was abandoned in the early 1950's. The oxidation ponds were filled with waste, debris, and ash following the abandonment of the treatment facility. Approximately 19,000 tons of waste, debris, and contaminated soils were removed and transported to off-site treatment and/or disposal facilities. Excavations at the former oxidation pond area will be filled with clean soil and a Summary Report will be prepared.
