U.S. Navy Continues Groundwater Response Actions at NASA Crows Landing Flight Facility

The Navy continued to extract contaminated groundwater from the Administration Area Plume at NASA Crows Landing Flight Facility (former Naval Auxiliary Landing Field, Crows Landing) during 2002, and groundwater extraction activities will continue in 2003. Approximately 70 pounds of contaminants - gasoline, acetone, benzene, and other contaminants - were removed with the extracted groundwater during 2002. Routine groundwater monitoring activities will continue to be conducted at quarterly intervals during 2003. The groundwater extraction and monitoring activities have been described in plans and reports that are maintained in the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) Administrative Record at Southwest Division, Naval Facilities Engineering Command, San Diego, California. Selected documents are also maintained at the local information repository at the Patterson Library at 46 North Salado, Patterson, California.
