## Navy Unveils New Plan for Site 25 at Former NAS Moffett Field



During and since the Site 25 Proposed Plan Public Meeting, new information has become available that has caused the Navy to reconsider the strategy for the site. The Navy is revising the Site 25 Feasibility Study to incorporate this new information. A feasibility study is part of the federal regulatory process for cleaning up hazardous waste sites. It characterizes the nature and extent of risks from hazardous wastes and identifies potential options for reducing those risks.

The new information obtained about the site includes:

- Identification of the Midpeninsula Regional Open Space District property as part of the site.
- Recognition of the Midpeninsula Regional Open Space District's land use considerations.
- Storm water management practices within the Eastern-Diked Marsh.
- Identification of new sources, such as Hangar 1, as well as control measures.

The Navy will reevaluate the site based on this new information and according to the nine criteria set out in CERCLA, the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act. The new plan for management of Site 25 will be presented and discussed at the September 25<sup>th</sup> meeting of the former NAS Moffett Field Restoration Advisory Board (RAB). The RAB meeting will take place from 7 to 9:30 p.m. at the Mountain View City Hall, Fourth Floor Gallery, 500 Castro Street. Interested members of the public are encouraged to attend.
